Silt Retention Basin Update

The construction on the silt retention basin is coming along. Fischer Excavating, the company doing the construction, has installed the pipes that will allow water to drain from the upper collection basin(s) to the lower basin(s).

Lately, they've been busy with the final grading and the spreading of black dirt, then they will seed and cover the banks with an erosion control blanket. The RCD, along with Joe Rush, Lost Lake Biologist, and Scott Brown, from

Wendler Engineering, are working on bids to remove large amounts of silt from the lake hydraulically. Using specialized equipment to dredge the lake from a floating platform, the hydraulic dredge operator will collect the silt and pump it up to the finished Silt Retention Basin to dewater. The RCD's plan is to do this in the spring of 2022.

Ice Fishing on Lost Lake

Ice fishing season will soon be here. The RCD asks that you access the lake to ice fish from RCD properties. Please be respectful of private property around the lake. Ask for permission first and leave nothing behind but your foot prints. RCD fishing creel regulations are on our website.
